

"Nothing has been solved, and I sometimes feel nothing is happening. The nuclear power plant is still unstable and we as a family are living in great anxiety. I feel powerless and lost when I think about the future. Everyone has to live in this anxiety for hundreds of years to come. Thus my conclusion is obvious: "no more nuclear power" . (woman, age 50)

"Living in Fukushima, what I now want most is uncontaminated food. Breathing the air is unavoidable and a mask isn't really helpful. I can do nothing to avoid external irradiation. But I still have a choice when it comes to what I eat. I don't wish for anybody to experience this kind of life in the future. Not in Fukushima, nor elsewhere" . (man, age 40)

FUKUSHIMA BADGE PROJECT

On October 20, 2011, the Fukushima prefectural assembly unanimously adopted a petition that demanded abolition of all 10 nuclear reactors located in the prefecture.

On November 30, 2011, Mr. Yuhei Sato, the governor of Fukushima, declared that the prefectural recovery plan would include the sentence "We require TEPCO and the Japanese government to close down all the nuclear power plants in Fukushima prefecture"

On March 11, 2013, Governor Sato gave the world the 'Fukushima Declaration' which "aims to promote renewable energy and to realize a sustainable society that does not depend on nuclear energy"

- We think that the prefectural assembly members, who unanimously agreed to forgo nuclear power, should play a leading role in promoting the closing down of nuclear power plants.
- We are delivering the badges to the prefectural and municipal leaders, assembly members, and the municipal office workers if they agree.

Wear it! Anti-nuclear people are everywhere.

Oil can be extracted from the nanohana plant for bio fuel. In Chernobyl, this plant has been cultivated extensively since the nuclear accident there. As they grow, the plants extract radioactive particles from the soil. I once met an elderly man, an evacuee from Namie town. He told me that he wants to plant nanohana in the land of Namie. Sure, the topsoil which is essential for the growth of farming plants can be removed by decontamination processes, but that operation ruins farming land. Instead of removing contaminated topsoil, with nanohana plants absorbing radiation, the contaminated land will be able to recover someday in the future. My hope lays on Nanohana, which is why I included it in the badge.
